



IntraLinks and Copernicus Group IRB Sign Co-Marketing Agreement

Strategic Alliance to Speed Clinical Trials

Copernicus Group protects the rights and welfare of human research subjects involved in clinical drug trials. Under the terms of the agreement, IntraLinks will help expedite the flow of information among members of the pharmaceutical community and Copernicus Group will leverage IntraLinks' drug development hub to speed the clinical trial process.

"Our first duty is to protect subjects involved in clinical trials," said Sharon Hill Price, Founder and Chief Executive Officer at Copernicus Group IRB. "Working with IntraLinks will allow us to streamline the study start-up process. In turn we will be better able to focus our attention on issues of importance to the protection of human subjects and perhaps speed the time it takes for a safe and effective drug or device to get to market."

Institutional Review Boards (IRBs) play a critical role in the clinical trials process, serving as independent or institutional committees charged with protecting the rights, safety and well-being of human subjects. As a part of that process, IRBs review documentation submitted by pharmaceutical sponsors and investigator sites prior to the introduction of subjects to a clinical trial. IntraLinks enables IRBs to share this documentation online with sponsors and investigator sites via secure, electronic workspaces, cutting weeks or months off trial periods. In addition to sophisticated document permissioning tools and security functions, the workspaces are designed for compliance with the Food and Drug Administration's 21 CFR Part 11 guidelines. Copernicus Group is the sixth IRB to partner with IntraLinks, joining Chesapeake Research Review, Inc., Coast IRB, Quorum Review IRB, Schulman Associates IRB, and Western IRB.

"We are pleased to add Copernicus Group to our network of IRB partners," said Richard Jenkins, Vice President of Business Development for IntraLinks. "Further integrating our services into the pharmaceutical community will make the site initiation process more efficient."

Using IntraLinks, Copernicus Group will be able to replace time-consuming paper driven processes with a secure, electronic process. Approval letters are able to be posted online, with investigator sites and pharmaceutical sponsors notified immediately via email alerts. Each of IntraLinks' IRB partners has a specific template on the IntraLinks service for trial sponsors to use when submitting credentials for review.
